Give us this day our daily bread. Matthew 6:11



Daily Faith, Daily Bread

It is hard to imagine a shorter verse of Scripture that contains a larger history and summary of the dependence of God's people upon Him: "Give us this day our daily bread." Those are the words of instruction Jesus taught His disciples to pray in "The Lord's Prayer." The attentive disciple, upon hearing those words, would have immediately remembered the account of God's provision in the wilderness for the redeemed Hebrew slaves.



For almost forty years, God provided manna for the Israelites to eat—a seed or grain-like substance on which they subsisted (Exodus 16). But that provision was a test of their faith in God's promise to provide (verse 4). They were to gather daily what they needed for only that day. In the same way, Jesus taught His disciples not to worry about tomorrow, but to trust God every

day for daily bread (Matthew 6:25-34). He reminded them that worrying brings nothing; faith in God brings provision.

Often, we gather what we think we need: everything we need to begin life in college, everything we need to welcome a firstborn child into our home, everything we need to get our children back to school in September—but invariably we discover we have forgotten something. Try as we might, it's hard to be fully prepared for life.

Or is it? The apostle Peter wrote that God has "given to us all things that pertain to life and godliness." That isn't a guarantee that our checklist for every life circumstance will be perfectly completed. But it does mean, when it comes to living a godly life, we have everything we need in Christ. By knowing God through Christ, we have access to His character and resources that abide in us. Paul characterized these traits in Galatians 5:22-23 as the fruit of the Spirit. Peter's list includes faith, virtue, knowledge, self-control, perseverance, godliness, brotherly kindness, and love (2 Peter 1:5-7).


If you have a need, don't let anxiety replace your faith. Let your requests be made known to God with thanksgiving and receive His peace as you wait upon Him. He will guard your heart and mind in Christ Jesus (Philippians 4:6-7).

Just as Christ lacked nothing in His life, we have everything we need for our life through Him.
