

Love Conquers All: Love Conquers Fear

Children find it easy to trust. When a child experiences fear, the assurance of a loving parent is enough to bring them peace. The child doesn't know how the parent can defeat the "monsters under the bed," the raging thunder and lightning, or the uncertainty of a first day of school. They just know that, if their parent assures them, they are safe.

Jesus suggested we would do well to emulate the faith of children (Matthew 18:3). When we rest in the assurance of God's love and protection, we will find our fear subsiding. But it's a process, with us as it is with children. The apostle John wrote that "perfect love casts out fear." If we find ourselves in fear, then we have not yet matured fully in our understanding of God's love. There is a correlation between our sense of security and the depth of our understanding of God's love.



When you experience fear or insecurity, meditate on Ephesians 3:17-19. Contemplate "the width and length and depth and height" of "the love of Christ."



How Peculiar!

But ye are...a peculiar people. 1 Peter 2:9, KJV

Many of the older translations of the Bible used the word peculiar to describe the people of God. In the King James Version, for example, we learn that Israel is to be God's "peculiar treasure" (Exodus 19:5) and that Christians are to be a "peculiar people, zealous for good works" (Titus 2:14). Newer versions update the language, telling us we are a special people.



Peculiar now has a different connotation.

And yet... A. W. Tozer wrote, "A real Christian is an odd number anyway. He feels supreme love for One whom he has never seen, talks familiarly every day to Someone he cannot see, expects to go to heaven on the virtue of Another, empties himself in order to be full, admits he is wrong so he can be declared right, goes down in order to get up, is strongest when he is weakest, richest when he is poorest and happiest when he feels worst. He dies so he can live, forsakes in order to have, gives away so he can keep, sees the invisible, hears the inaudible and knows that which passes knowledge."
